

# Peeping Toms

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48 x 48 inches

You will need for this toddler quilt;

Background fabric – 1 ½ yard

Sashing fabric – 1 ¼ yard

Border fabric – 1 ½ yard

Cat fabrics – 9 or 10 assorted fat quarters

Base blocks = 9 @ 12 ½ inches

Sashing strips = 12 @ 2 x 12 ½ inches

4 @ 2 x 42 ½ inches

Border strips = 2 @ 42 ½ x 3 ½ inches

2 @ 48 ½ x 3 ½ inches

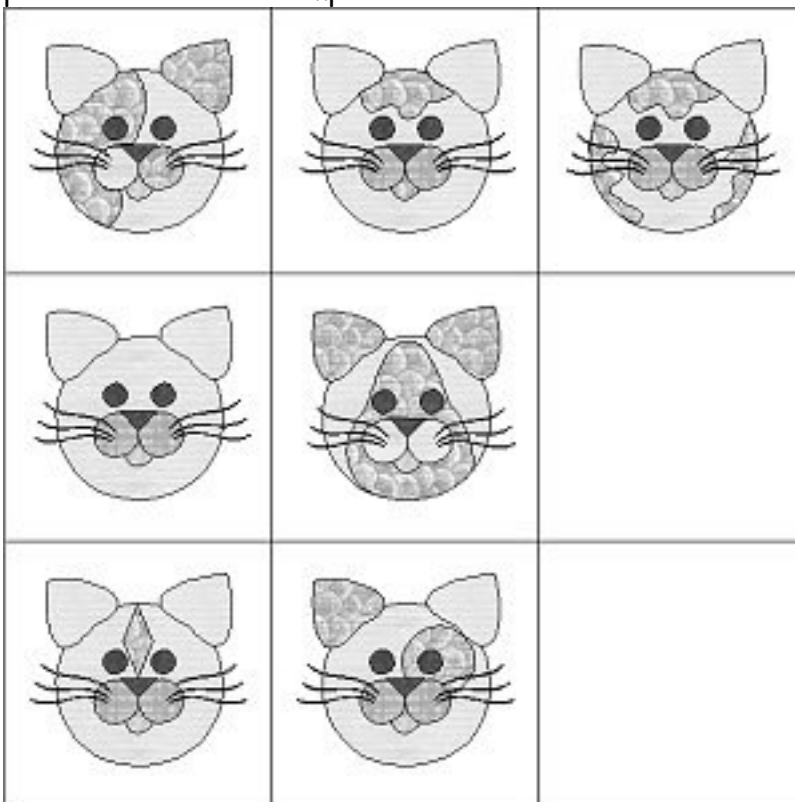
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Below you see all the different cat faces that are possible with these templates



1. Cut one 12 ½ inch base block for each cat for a total of 9 blocks
2. Using a light weigh fusible trace all your kitties and fuse to their fabrics. Once that is done you can start playing around with laying them out. It is amazing what kind of attitude you can portray with the angle of an ear ☺ Iron them down to the base blocks, following the instructions on your fusible.
3. Machine satin or button hole stitch them securely to the bases. It really helps to have a tear away stabilizer under your block.
4. Sew your blocks into 3 rows with sashing between. Sew your rows together as in the picture, with the longer sashing strips connecting them.
5. Cut 4 border strips. Attach the borders to the top and bottom, then press open. Trim away the excess. Attach the borders to the sides, press open.
6. Finish your quilt in your preferred method.

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Key Block (29/100 actual size)
